## **Activities**

Find another person who could be shown on each of the pages. For example, who else has taken a first step somewhere?

Find a significant event from each year on the book's timeline and make your own.

Create an obstacle course from actions found in the book: step along a balance beam, leap over a "puddle", climb across the monkey bars, kick a soccer ball.

Plant flower seeds and track their growth.

Play *Telephone*: Form a line and the first person in line is given a phrase. Each person whispers the phrase to their neighbor. See how close the final phrase is to the initial one.

### **Discussion Questions**

How did each of the people in this story "move the world"?

How will you move the world?

 What are some characteristics or skills you
 need to be a world-mover? Think about the people mentioned in this book and list some qualities they shared.

# **Writing Prompts**

Who moves your world? Make a timeline of important moments or events in your life and list the people who helped you get there.

Share a time when you moved the world for someone else.

#### **Artistic Activities**

Design and build a paper airplane.

Design and create a classroom or family mural that illustrates how you are moving the world.

Put on a talent show that highlights individual or group talents, like dancing or singing.
